## IN THE BEGINNING

**Chapter 180:** Community Thanksgiving Service  
(October/November 1990)

Sunday morning October 7, 1990, **Anna Margaret Suhring**, daughter of **Steve Suhring** (Praise Band and adult class teacher) and **Beth Lyon-Suhring** (Director of Christian Education), was baptized by **Reverend Jack Ettershank**.<sup>\*</sup> Anna is now a second grade teacher at Graham Road Elementary School in Falls Church, Virginia.

On October 21, **Woody**<sup>\*</sup> and **Ruth Downing** were greeters. People were asked to check their information in the old directory. The next Sunday, the pages of the old directory were spread on a table in the hallway (we only had one hall at this time) and people were asked to check and or correct their information.

The church family enjoyed a Stewardship/Fellowship dinner including Brunswick stew, cornbread, coleslaw and dessert on November 4. It must have been an excellent dinner because the next Sunday's bulletin had a sincere thank you for **Robert**<sup>\*</sup> and **Helena Thompson**<sup>1</sup> (and Robert's father) who cooked the stew. **Kathy Pietrasanta**<sup>2</sup> and **Jeff Church** were also thanked for their part in the meal.

The community Thanksgiving service took place at Ebenezer Methodist Church with Zion Christian Church and St. Andrew. The special offering was given to the Genieve Shelter, a private non-profit organization providing twenty-four hour assistance, as well as many other services, to battered spouses and families.

## TEMPLE TIPS

*"The Lord God formed the man from the dust of the ground and breathed into his nostrils the breath of life, and the man became a living being."*  
~Genesis 1:7

Feeling breathless or short of breath can be scary, (unless you are breathlessly in love or just finished a race) and typically caused by acute illness or accident. Those of us with chronic obstructive pulmonary disease, COPD, live with this condition. Your lungs are supposed to be like soft, pliable, balloons with numerous branching passageways that end in tiny sacs. Sometimes you have airways that stay swollen and irritated with too much secretions, sometimes the problem is scarred broken down airway sacs, or sometimes it is tight, spastic airway passages. Any of these problems will limit the lungs ability to exchange oxygen into and carbon dioxide out of your bloodstream. The symptoms typically develop slowly and get worse over time. These conditions describe chronic bronchitis, emphysema and asthma. You should talk with your health care provider for diagnosis and treatment. COPD symptoms can be managed with proper medical care and lifestyle but this chronic illness can make acute illness worse and more difficult to recover. I am reminded of the hymn lyrics "Breathe on me breath of God, fill me with life anew, so that I may love what thou dost love and do what thou wouldst do" by Edwin Hatch.

**NEW!! Suffolk Library Snack Program:** In October 2018 a representative from the Suffolk Library attended the Suffolk Pastors' Group asking for assistance for a situation that is occurring at the Morgan Library in downtown Suffolk. There are approximately 30 children coming to this library after school each day as a "safe place" until their parents come home from work each evening. As expected, the children are hungry when they arrive. Some of the children come with money that they can use in the library's vending machines. Others, however, do not bring money and in some cases, they have solicited people on the street for money so they can buy these snacks when they enter the library.

The library representative was hoping that the area churches would assist in finding a solution to this situation. Many of the churches are very interested in helping the library, including St. Andrew. Pastor Gillian brought this request to the Presbyterian Women and since then we have been working to understand the issue and find some way to assist. We have secured a PEVA Hunger Grant given to help feed local communities in need of food. This situation qualified and PEVA awarded the St. Andrew PW \$1,000 to partially fund our efforts to assist in providing after-school snacks for these children. We are hoping that with this money and other contributions we can provide snacks to the Morgan Library for the rest of this school year. We have estimated that each month it will cost approximately \$250-\$350 to feed around 30 children for the 20 school days each month. Obviously the \$1,000 will go quickly. We are hoping that other churches will follow St. Andrew and provide help as well; extending the time that we can provide snacks this year.

PW hopes to begin providing snacks in February, assuming that the last details can be resolved. With Session approval, PW would like to ask the congregation to help with this project. If you would be interested in helping, either with a donation of money, snacks, or by helping with the development of materials to give the children with the snacks that identifies this contribution is from St. Andrew, please contact **Kay Smith** at [jokaysmith@charter.net](mailto:jokaysmith@charter.net), St. Andrew Presbyterian Women Moderator. We have been provided this opportunity for outreach to our community; something that St. Andrew has designated as one of our church's missions.

Despite some major unexpected expenses and planned upgrades (lightning damage; replacements of air conditioning units, windows, refrigerators and stoves; upgrade of the sanctuary audio/visual system; upgrade of the website; etc.), St. Andrew finished 2018 with a small surplus over the expenses projected in the budget. This was the result of an income that was slightly larger than expected and overall expenses that were less than expected, capped off with a great December push. Thank you all for your excellent stewardship of St. Andrew's finances!

2019 is shaping up to be a year of further improvement, with a balanced budget projected, increased pledged income (thank you again!) and a bigger push toward being self-sustaining. For more detailed numbers, please see the Annual Report.
