PENTECOST SUNDAY

The outpouring of the Holy Spirit upon Jesus' first followers on the day of Pentecost is often called the Church's birthday. Today, congregations still observe it in special ways, using the color red to symbolize the Holy Spirit's power. **Wear red on June 9, Pentecost Sunday.**

The Pentecost Offering is the second special offering of the year of the Presbyterian Church, USA. It will be received on Pentecost Sunday, June 9. This offering allows Presbyterians to invest in the church's greatest resource – our youth – and join in ministries that address the needs of at-risk children and encourage, grow and support our young people. **40% of the offering will be retained by St. Andrew** for investment in local programs focused on children at risk and development of youth. The remainder will be used by the larger Presbyterian Church to support Young Adult Volunteers (25%), Ministries with Youth (25%) and Advocacy for At-Risk Children (10%). Walter (Jack) Holiday at 90

By 1991, Jack Holladay* and his wife Mary Grice* had moved to the Westminster Canterbury Retirement Center in Virginia Beach and he was Elder Emeritus at St. Andrew. He was the first adult church school teacher when we had one adult class in the Community Building. After the church split with the Methodist group, Jack was a guiding member of the Steering/Planning Committee that organized and governed the congregation. He was one of the first three elders in the church (ordained on December 13, 1981) when the church was chartered.

When asked what he wanted to do for his 90th birthday, Jack told his family he wanted to return to St. Andrew for a worship service. On February 17, Jack's visiting day, the class had been organized for twenty-two years. The congregation was invited to stay after the worship service and enjoy cake and coffee with Jack and his family.

On Sunday March 3, 1991, seven new members joined the church. Of that group, only **Joel & Frances Robb** are still here. Their two children, now grown, were **Ashlee** (4 ½) and **Jenna** (2). Not only are the Robb's still here, they have continually been active both as officers and teachers. Joe taught the Jack Holladay Class for years. Frances has been a children's teacher and was Fellowship Chair when our church population grew so large it became impossible to continue the long tradition (from our days of worshiping in the Manse) of the Second Sunday Lunches.

TEMPLE TIPS

"And God said, 'Let there be an expanse between the waters to separate water from water'...And there was evening, and there was morning- the second day." ~Genesis 1:7

June is Safety Awareness Month. I want to focus on water safety for children since summer is here. National Safety Council reports drowning as a leading cause of death for young children. Parents need to be aware of safety with recreational swimming (and in the bathtub!). Be attentive when your child is around the water. Designate an adult to be the "water watcher" to actively supervise children who are swimming. It is easy to get distracted with your phone, conversation or reading; but drowning can happen quickly, quietly and in a little as one inch of water. Have your children learn to swim and be aware of safety issues when in or around water. Swimming lessons can start as young as 6 months old, teaching young children survival skills of floating and treading water. An adult should be no more than an arm's length away if small children are in the water. Even if lifeguards are present it is important to watch over your children. Do not underestimate the power of water: tides, undertows, currents, or drains can overwhelm children's strength and abilities. The water can be an enticing place to play or cool off. If a child is missing, check nearby water first!

There will be all the VBS pieces you've come to love: dinner together each night, singing, Bible stories, an intergenerational program for all ages, an adult program, and art, drama, and games workshops for the kids. Of course we'll also have a nursery for our youngest children.

Co-directors **Chelsea Foust, Sara Collins, and Karen Topping** are hard at work on plans, and you'll be hearing more about it all as time draws closer.

Please set this time apart on your busy schedules, and plan to bring YOUR neighbors, young and old!

JUNE CHILDREN'S CHURCH SCHOOL MISSION: POSSIBLE RETURNS!

CrossWalk-aged students (4-year olds through 5th graders this past school year), with assistance from the Youth, will turn their minds and hearts toward mission in June as **Mission: Possible** returns. Each Sunday students will focus on a specific need in our community, and they will participate in a hands-on activity to help answer that need.

Three of our Sundays will be focused on food needs in Suffolk and on the Eastern Shore:

Food for Migrant Farm Workers. We will be working with the Presbytery's Hunger Ministry Team, which supplies migrant camps on the Eastern Shore of Virginia with food and other supplies. We will be putting together canvas grocery bags of food with the following ingredients: **MASECA cornmeal for tortillas, bags of dried beans (pinto or black only), oil for cooking, rice (enriched long grain only), and canned jalapeno peppers.** If you have spare **reusable grocery bags** to donate, we can use those, too! Farmworkers are the backbone of the local agricultural economy, but they often do not have enough to eat. Help us help them.

Summer Cereal Drive. Again, we'll be working with the Hunger Ministry Team of PEVA. Children who rely on free or reduced price breakfast and lunch at

school often go without enough to eat during the summer at home. We'll be collecting boxes of cereal and oatmeal, and our Mission: Possible kids will pack them up. One half will go to Suffolk's Food Pantry, and PEVA will take the other half to regional food banks. **Please donate any size boxes of cereal and oatmeal.**

Blessing Bags. One of St. Andrew's most popular mission projects is our bin of Blessing Bags – zip-lock bags with water and snacks – that members keep in their cars and hand out to those in need they encounter in our surrounding communities. We have heard wonderful stories of kids who insist that their families make u-turns in the middle of traffic, just so that they can get to someone who needs help. We are hoping that we can get: **small bottles of water, peanut butter or cheese sandwich crackers, granola bars, small packages of nuts, etc.**

All donations may be put in marked bins in the Atrium. **Deadline for all donations is Sunday, June 16.**

Mission: Possible will run Sundays at 9:45 throughout the month of June. All children will meet in Room 104 on the first floor of the education building.
