Ramen noodles, Hamburger Helper or other meal starters, canned chicken, canned tuna, or soup.



Dear Friends, Summer provides an opportunity for us to slow down a little, to pause and to recharge. The daily rhythms of life change

and we take time to enjoy the longer days, the warmth of the sunshine and, if we are fortunate, a change of scenery with vacations in places that restore our souls.

And as summer draws to a close, we turn our thoughts toward the new church year that begins on Rally Sunday, September 11th. In pondering where God is leading us at St Andrew as we look to the fall and our continuing mission and ministry, I am encouraged by these words from Oscar Romero, the late Archbishop of San Salvador:

"It helps now and then, to step back and take the long view The Kingdom of God is not only beyond our efforts, it is even beyond our vision. We accomplish in our lifetime only a tiny fraction of the magnificent enterprise that is God's work. Nothing we do is complete, which is another way of saying that the Kingdom always lies beyond us. This is what we are about: we plant seeds that one day will grow. We water seeds already planted, knowing they hold future promise. We lay foundations that will need further development. We provide yeast that produces effects beyond our capability. We cannot do everything, and there is a sense of liberation in realizing that truth. This enables us to do something and to do it very well. It may be incomplete, but it is a beginning, a step along the way, an opportunity for God's grace to enter and do the rest. We may never see the end results, but that is the difference between the Master builder and the worker. We are workers, not the Master builder, ministers, not Messiahs. We are prophets of a future not our own."

These words both inspire me and reassure me, for they serve as a reminder that we are the workers, and we are part of a wonderful enterprise, building God's kingdom, that began long before we arrived and, by God's grace, will continue long after we are gone. We do not need to be "messiahs" rather we need to be faithful to what God is calling us to do at this time and in this place. As we begin the new church year here at St Andrew, may we all take a moment, or two, to ask what is God calling us to do? Where is God leading us? What seeds of love must we sow? What can we do to take a step closer to these words from the Lord's Prayer becoming a reality,

"Thy Kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as it is in heaven."

SESSION HIGHLIGHTS

August 18, 2022 Stated Session Meeting

• With deep sorrow, recorded the deaths Barney Nawyn on July 8th, Bob Woods on July 18th and Ruth Downing on July 23rd.

• Approved a Mission & Service motion to authorize an appeal to the congregation for donations to support a full scholarship in the amount of \$3,620 to the St. Andrew Preschool for the coming school year for a Ukrainian child from a family that is being sponsored, in part, by Westminster Reformed Presbyterian Church. Donations will be deposited to earmark #3396 (Vanderslice Preschool Scholarship) with a current balance of \$626. Any funds in excess of the scholarship to remain in the earmark for future needs and any deficit to come from the Paul Reed Missions earmark (3240.3).

• Recorded adoption of the motion to approve the request from Property to award a \$2,500 contract to Hobbs Mechanical for replacement of the Bell Choir A/C unit compressor. The motion was made via email on July 28th and the vote was unanimous.

St. Andrew's Mid-Week Program for All Ages September 21 through November 16, 2022

Kirk Night,* St. Andrew's Wednesday night program for all ages, will begin again on Wednesday,



September 21. Kirk Night starts with a meal and includes classes or childcare for all ages. Come for the meal, join us for the classes, or take part in both. <u>Dinner</u> Kirk Night dinners are provided by a different church

organization each week. Check the church bulletin on Sunday to find the menu for Wednesday. Dinner begins at 5:45 p.m. and ends at 6:30 when classes start. The cost is \$4.50 for adults and \$2.50 for children, with a maximum charge of \$20.00 per family.

<u>Classes</u> Join our classes for elementary-aged children through adults. Nursery care is available for our youngest participants in Room 12 on the Preschool Hallway. Classes begin at 6:30 p.m. and run through 7:30 p.m. <u>For Children</u>

• 6:30-7:00 - **Music Makers Music Class** (Room 14, behind the sanctuary) Children from Kindergarten through fifth grade can participate in this child-centered music program. Led by Music Director **Al Reese**, children are introduced to new songs, musical prayers, and instruments that are all combined in Worship to praise God.

• 7:00-7:30 p.m. – The children's art class this fall will be **"Making a Jesse Tree: Exploring Jesus' Family Tree."** Each week children will create a new ornament representing one of Jesus' ancestors. CROSSWALK BEGINS ITS NINETEENTH YEAR "God Keeps Promises"

CrossWalk, St. Andrew's Sunday morning program for four-year-olds through fifth graders, will begin its nineteenth season of exploring Bible stories with children this fall. In this workshop-based curriculum, kids spend three to four weeks on each Bible story, each Sunday through the lens of a different activity: drama, cooking, science, video, games, art, etc. By the end of each rotation, our hope is that the story will have become a part of the fiber of our kids' faith.

Our 2022-2023 season will be focused on the theme of "God Keeps Promises." We'll spend the fall looking at Old Testament patriarchs – Abraham, Jacob, and Joseph. In the spring we'll spend several months with the major stories of Moses' life. And, of course, we'll look at God's promises through the Christmas and Easter stories as well.

CrossWalk begins each Sunday morning at 11:00 a.m. in Room 104 on the first floor of the education building. Classes for youth and adults also meet at this time. The first Sunday of class will be September 18. We look forward to having your children be part of CrossWalk!

Our income for July was over \$10,000 more than our monthly incomes in each of May and June. As a result of this increase, we showed a net income of \$3,279 for July. This makes our year-to-date (YTD) net income slightly positive, equal to \$2,864. Our committees have done a good job as stewards of St. Andrew's funds managing a YTD decrease in expenditures of about \$30,000 below the amount budgeted. The turnaround in the stock market in July helped us recover over \$34,000 of the previous losses in May and June that we had seen in our endowment funds. With current assets over \$93,000 more than current liabilities, our current financial health is very good. ~Finance & Stewardship Committee

Faith Lessons on the Promised Land by teacher and historian Ray Vander Laan is a video-based study, filmed on location in Israel. Participants will explore how God put a mark on God's people and on their land and how that mark still has relevance for faithful people today. Sermon on the Mount, A Beginner's Guide to the Kingdom of Heaven by Amy-Jill Levine. Matthew 5-7 is a compilation of some of Jesus' best-known teachings. In this series of classes, participants will learn about The Sermon from a first-century Jewish perspective, and in so doing better understand how these words can speak to us today. How do the ancient texts of the Bible have anything to say to 21st-century parents? The Homebuilders Class will engage with an event in the news each week through the lens of scripture. Rich discussions using these navigational tools will help parents find hope and direction in their daily lives. Led by Heather & Kevin Gregg and by Karen & Mike Topping, the Homebuilders Class meets in Room 101 on the first floor of the education building.


