Dear Friends,

As most of you know, the Peanuts gang with all their adventures give me many sermon illustrations. But equally, the comic strip, Calvin and Hobbes, provides good material and drives home some important truths. In one of my favorite cartoons of Calvin and his stuffed tiger, Hobbes, Calvin is talking to Susie, his arch enemy. They had both recently taken a test in class and Calvin was asking Susie about her grade. Susie tells Calvin, "I got an A." Calvin replies, "Really? Boy, I'd hate to be you. I got a C." Curious, Susie asks Calvin, "Why on earth would you rather get a C than an A?" To this Calvin smugly replies, "I find my life is a lot easier the lower I keep everyone's expectations."

Like most of these comic strips behind the humor a point is made that makes us stop and think.

As we enter the holiday season, expectations can be very high. We expect much of ourselves as we prepare and plan for gatherings and celebrations. There is, as always, too much to do and too little time in which to do it. We make great demands of ourselves, expecting that we will be all things to all people, that we will prepare the perfect meal, find the perfect gifts and, through it all, remain perfectly calm and in control. But we know in our hearts that, time and again, we do not always live up to the expectations we have of ourselves. Then there are the expectations that others have of us. We are expected to be on top of our game, when in fact we feel exhausted. We are expected to be the life and soul of any gathering, when we may find that we are sad because this season opens old wounds or makes the absence of loved ones more painful.

Perhaps we put our expectations in all the wrong places. Rather than expect so much of ourselves or others, we ought to remember that our expectations were surpassed in what is the heart of Christmas – God with us.

Our expectations are more than met in our faith in God, because Christmas is a reminder that God has come to us and continues to come to us, meeting us where we are whether that be in sadness or in joy. This Advent and Christmas, may we let go of the unreasonable expectations we have of ourselves, and not be overwhelmed by the expectations others have of us. Let us rather bask in the joy of what lies at the heart of Christmas, that which surpasses all expectations; that God has come to be with us and accepts us and love us as we are.

PRESBYTERIAN WOMEN SPONSORED CHRISTMAS

MISSION: Each Christmas season the Presbyterian Women

identify a local as well as an international mission that would benefit from financial support of our congregation. This year the PW recognizes Coalition Against Poverty in **Suffolk (CAPS)** which helps with the struggle of marginalized individuals and families as they negotiate difficulties with rent, utilities, or other personal necessities. There has been an increase of over 50% of calls for assistance this year. We would like to provide a donation to the rent subsidy program. Our international mission will buy Emergency Life Packs through presbyteriangifts.pcusa.org. The pack contains food, water, basic hygiene items, a blanket and other vital necessities. The packs are provided to churches assisting refugees and asylum seekers in border regions. Each pack is \$125. Church wide donations will begin from the first of December into early January. If you can contribute, please make a check out to "St. Andrew PW" with notation: "Christmas Mission" and place in Sandy Poole's church box. Donations will be divided between the two missions. St. Andrew has been so generous over the years to those in need and our sisters and brothers benefit from that generous love. If you have questions, contact Martha Shephard, PW Moderator.


