service. Pastor Gillian will recognize the teachers and families during the church service.





Dear Friends,

"Jesus called the disciples to him and said,
"I have compassion for these people."

(Mt. 15:32)

There is rarely a day that goes by without our seeing people who are in need of our compassion. On the news, there is an endless stream of human suffering and need that plays out before our eyes and leaves our hearts aching. The recent earthquake in Turkey and Syria has left millions without food and shelter. Tens of thousands have lost their lives and families grieve their passing while wondering how they will continue to live amidst the devastation. Hardly a day goes by, but some other crisis is drawn to our attention, whether that be through the daily news, strangers we meet in passing, or those we know and love whose pain hurts us deeply and causes us to feel powerless to help.

Hurting people turned up everywhere Jesus went, and his days were filled with trying to meet the myriad needs that people brought to him. There were the hungry who needed to be fed, and the beggars who were impoverished and to add to their pain were cast aside as worthless. Jesus met a father, desperate for his daughter to be healed, and a mother burying her only son. He came across a young person burdened by seizures and a leper ostracized by their community. With empathy and compassion, Jesus embraced them all and many more. He was patient with those who were distressed and wept with those who grieved. This depth of relentless compassion must surely have taken its toll on Jesus, yet day after day he gave of himself and the precious gift of kindhearted attention and love. In return for his compassion and empathy, Jesus was betrayed and denied, scorned and crucified. And yet, he continued to love, and even now loves us.

As we begin our own journey through Lent toward Holy Week, and then Easter Sunday, let us consider what we can do to stand in solidarity with those who hurt and suffer today. All of us have it within our power to ease the burdens of others, listening to their stories, offering a hand of friendship, helping as we are able to lighten the load and keeping others in our prayers.

May we also in our own lives, in these days when our hearts are weighed down by the ways of the world, know the gentle compassion and care of Jesus whose love for us stopped at nothing, not even a cross.

Uplifted and strengthened by the knowledge of this love, may we find it in our hearts to love others and play our part in helping to heal this world and the hearts within it that have been broken.

# St. Andrew's Quilting Ministry for those in need of prayers

Do you have a friend, co-worker, or family member that has health issues, is experiencing difficulties, or is making challenging decisions? Let them know God is with them by sharing a prayer quilt with them. You can choose a Prayer Pocket Square or a lap quilt Prayer Quilt.

Prayer Pocket Squares are small quilted squares with one tie that you can send in a card or letter or give to a friend, or give to someone to show you are thinking of them and praying for them. You do not have to make a request. Look for them in a plastic bin in the atrium. Anyone can just look at the squares in the bin and choose one to give to someone. Say a prayer, tie a knot, place it in a thinking of you card and give it. Let someone know you care and are praying for them.

You may request a Prayers and Squares lap sized quilt by completing a request form found at the Welcome Kiosk or by contacting **Frances Jornov** (francesjrnv@charter.net or 757-646-8955). Place the form in the mailbox in the office or give it to Frances. These quilts will be placed on a quilt rack in the atrium for people to say a prayer and tie a knot. There are many completed quilts in our cabinet. It is a great pleasure to share God's love by giving a quilt to someone.

Prayers and Squares will meet on **Saturday**, **March 25**, at 10:00am. We will only meet once in March. We can use all helpers and you don't need to know how to sew. There are jobs that don't require sewing skills and all ages are welcome. Also, we are beginning to create quilts to give to the children as part of their Angel Tree gifts again this December. Interested in helping us--come join us.

Our income for January was slightly more than \$4,000 under the monthly amount that we budgeted. Much of this shortfall was the result of late receipt of pledged amounts. Fortunately, because of the good stewardship of St. Andrew's resources, our expenses for January were significantly below our estimated monthly expenses. However, we still showed a net deficit of \$4,095. Both of our endowment funds recovered a bit from the declines of 2022, now totaling \$574,101. Our current assets are healthy. They exceed our current liabilities by \$59,628. Our only long-term liability is our mortgage which now totals \$492,111.


