Dear Friends,

Many years ago, I was introduced by a Quaker friend to the writings of Oriah Mountain Dreamer. One of her most well-known poems, The Invitation, asks some great questions -

"It doesn't interest me what you do for a living. I want to know what you ache for and if you dare to dream of meeting your heart's longing...... It doesn't interest me where or what or with whom you have studied. I want to know what sustains you from the inside when all else falls away. I want to know if you can be alone with yourself and if you truly like the company you keep in the empty moments."

It is, for sure, a searching question about what sustains us when all else falls away. Where do we find the energy, strength, wisdom, inspiration to keep going when we feel like everything we knew and relied upon falls away. We can only avoid for so long the truth that our health can be taken from us, our wealth may dwindle, our careers may falter, our relationships may sour, our hopes might be dashed, and our fears may be realized. Life is fragile and these are difficult times through which we are all living. So, where do we turn for sustenance?

For many of us, sustenance comes from being in community and from the deep connection and bonds that we have established with each other. At St Andrew, there is a rich system of support that we offer to one another as we serve, grow, learn and worship together. And ultimately, it is our connection to and our relationship with God that is the most powerful sustaining force in our lives.

When all else falls away, there is God.

God is not some distant deity, unmoved by the plight of what it means to be human. In the life and teaching, death and resurrection of Jesus, we see God in flesh and blood, present with us and relentless on our side. When all else falls away, we are confident that God sustains us and longs for us to be in relationship.

Jesus said it most beautifully in these words from John's Gospel, "I am the vine, and you are the branches. Whoever remains in me, and I in them, will bear much fruit; for you can do nothing without me."

May our faith and trust in God sustain us and may we know that in our empty, quiet moments, when we are alone with ourselves, God is also with us.



Both our year-to-date (YTD) income and expenses were below the budgeted amounts. Our net Loss for March was over \$2,000 resulting in a YTD net loss of over \$9,000. Our current assets Are still comfortably greater than our current liabilities by almost \$60,000, and our endowment Funds total \$563,644. Our major liability is the mortgage that we have on our property which now has a balance of \$485,329.
