



## **IUNE CHURCH SCHOOL FOR ALL AGES**

Join us each Sunday in June at 11:00 a.m. in the Atrium as we explore ways to care for the beautiful bluegreen planet that God has given to us to cherish. Here for a Purpose: Celebrating and Caring for the Earth, our series of classes on earth care this summer, will focus on ways that we can make a difference in our everyday lives. Our June classes will be intergenerational – ages four through one hundred four – and will be hands-on in nature.

#### Here's what we have planned:

June 4 – Caring for the Earth in Our Buildings – We'll talk about energy use and waste in our homes and businesses and learn how to do a basic energy audit in the church. Using what we learn will save money and care for the earth at home, too.

June 11 – Caring for the Earth in Our Yards – Mary Catherine Foster, a Master Naturalist, will talk about the importance of pollinating insects to the natural world. We'll work together on making some pots of flowers to draw pollinators, and we'll set them out in the front of the church. We'll also make individual biodegradable pots and plant seeds to take home for our own yards.

June 18 – Caring for the Earth in Our Kitchens – One of the biggest causes of greenhouse gas emissions is the meat industry, particularly beef. Even minor changes in our diets could help to reduce these planet-warming emissions. In "The Great St. Andrew Cook-Off" we'll try out some summer salad recipes that use protein sources lower on the food chain.

June 25 – Caring for the Earth in Our Missions – The Earth provides food for each of us, but the bounty comes through the hard work of farmers. We'll partner with the Presbytery of Eastern Virginia again this summer as they provide much-needed groceries to migrant farmworkers on the Eastern Shore. We'll pack bags of donated groceries to send off to two Headstart centers, where they will be distributed to those who help put food on our tables.

Plan to join us immediately after worship this summer as we learn to be better stewards of what God has provided.

# FOOD COLLECTION FOR MIGRANT FARMWORKERS ON THE EASTERN SHORE

St. Andrew will partner with the Presbytery of Eastern Virginia again this summer as we collect groceries for migrant farmworkers on Virginia's Eastern Shore. Our goal this year will be thirty bags of groceries with contributions from St. Andrew congregants, supplemented by donations from the Suffolk Food Pantry.

Bring your donations to the marked bins in the Atrium. The deadline for donations is June 25. Here's what we need for each bag:

4-lb bag of MASECA (cornmeal)
2-lb bag of dried black or pinto beans
16 to 48-oz bottle of cooking oil
12 to 18-oz can or jar of jalapeno peppers
All-purpose flour

Reusable canvas or plastic shopping bag with handles

# PRAYERS AND SQUARES: SHARING PRAYERS AND GOD'S LOVE

While reading some old emails, this information was found. Thought it would be fun to share some of our Prayers and Squares history.

Can you touch a prayer or pull it close and feel its comfort? You can if it's part of a prayer quilt.

Prayers & Squares, The Prayer Quilt Ministry, began in 1992 at Hope United Methodist Church in San Diego, California. Since then, it has expanded to include chapters in churches of many different denominations across the country and in Australia and the Marshall Islands. The idea behind these quilts is simple, yet powerful. A heavy thread is used to take stitches through the quilt layers, and the ends are left free to be tied with a square knot. As each knot is tied, a silent prayer is offered for someone in special need – someone who has asked us to pray for them. The quilt is then given to that particular person. What makes each quilt special is the fact that prayer is symbolically tied into each one. They are a statement of faith, and a testimony to our belief in God and in the power of prayer.

If you have a friend or family member that you would like to receive a prayer quilt, you may request a Prayers and Squares quilt by completing a request form found at the kiosk by the doors as you enter the atrium. Place the form in the mailbox in the office or give it to Frances Jornov. You may also phone Frances (757-646-8955). There are many completed quilts in our cabinet. It is a great pleasure to share God's love by giving a quilt to someone.

Would you like to learn more about how you can become involved in this outreach mission program? We need people to press fabric, tie knots, match up fabric, cut, hand and machine sew. If you are interested in learning, we would love to have you join us. The meetings for June are Friday, June 9 and Saturday, June 24 at 10:00-12:00 in St. Andrew Hall.

Both our year-to-date (YTD) income and expenses were below the budgeted amounts. Our net Loss for March was over \$2,000 resulting in a YTD net loss of over \$9,000. Our current assets are still comfortably greater than our current liabilities by almost \$60,000, and our Endowment Funds total \$563,644. Our major liability is the mortgage that we have on our property which now has a balance of \$485,329.
