GIFT CARDS FOR COLLEGE STUDENTS



Dear Friends.

"Universal peace can only come if we develop and awaken the capacity to love people, to respect them deeply, to live authentic relationships with others, to yearn for truth and justice in the huge family of humanity."

~ Jean Vanier

Once again, as I sit down to write to you, we find ourselves watching yet another war unfold with all the suffering it inevitably brings to those caught in the midst of it. As if it were not enough that the war in Ukraine rumbles on, there is now escalating war in the Middle East and tensions continue to rise in various parts of our troubled world. The heartfelt aspirations of billions of people are for universal peace, and these dreams further away than ever from being realized. Jean Vanier writes that for universal peace to become anything near a reality we must "develop and awaken the capacity to love people."

The fact that he uses the word "develop" is a reminder that it takes work, hard work, to awaken the capacity to love people. It is even harder to develop this capacity when we see how inhumane we have become toward one another. Much of what we see people doing to each other sickens us and makes us despair for ourselves and the future of our planet. Love may, indeed, be the last thing on our mind.

But we are all part of this huge family of humanity, as Vanier says. And I suspect that the vast majority of us all want the same things; truth, justice, peace, people to love and people to love us.

We cannot change much of what we see happening around the globe, but rather than give in to despair and the feeling of being hopeless and helpless, we each have the capacity to love and respect others. In the life of Jesus, we see this love which was extended even to the most unlovable and those whom others had shunned and rejected. And in the life of Jesus we are given, repeatedly, clear examples of loving beyond the usual boundaries that we are so adept at creating.

The scene at the well in John's gospel is a stark reminder of the expansive, radical love that Jesus showed us as an example to follow. When a woman of ill repute who was a Samaritan met Jesus, he showed her nothing but love and respect and in so doing broken down the barriers between the sexes, between saint and sinner, between Jew and Samaritan. If we are to make any inroad into creating universal peace then we must find ways to sincerely follow Jesus, and develop and awaken our capacity to love people, always mindful that we love because we have first been loved by God.

May God's peace and love be with you all.

SESSION HIGHLIGHTS

October 19, 2023 Stated Meeting

- Approved request from Jeff and Jennifer Coston for transfer of their membership to Bethlehem United Methodist Church in Moneta, VA.
- Approved request from the Christian Education Committee for a Preschool Fundraiser in November. The proceeds will support the Preschool staff attendance at the 2024 VAAEYC conference.
- Received the Finance Committee's report on the recently completed financial audit and approved their motion to implement the audit recommendation to which will require the Disbursing Treasurer to review, sign and date the monthly bank statements, which will be filed in the church office and reviewed semi-annually by the Trustees. Decided to not implement the audit recommendation regarding two signatures on checks over a predetermined amount as the existing voucher signature process provides sufficient control.
- Approved Finance Committee's recommendation to move \$50,000 from the recently matured CD at Edward Jones into the Towne Bank checking account to assure sufficient cash reserves. The remaining balance will be reinvested in another CD at the best rate available.

PRESBYTERIAN WOMEN SPONSORED CHRISTMAS MISSION

(The congregation is invited to participate.)

Every Christmas season, PW solicits congregational support for local as well as international needs for our **Christmas Mission**. <u>Local support</u> will go to Children's Hospital of the King Daughters (CHKD) which

recognizes the growing concern for children and youth with mental health challenges. Their "Lighting the Way" campaign is an effort to address the lack of mental health services for children and youth in our area and beyond. The initial campaign helped build a 14-story pavilion on the main campus in Norfolk. There are ongoing needs for mental health programs for outpatient, inpatient, and partial hospitalization services. It goes without saying that a child's mental health is critically important for so many reasons. As CHKD says: "Please join us in lighting the way to a brighter future for all our children by making a gift to our mental health campaign".

Internationally, the identified need is for ongoing support of the citizens of Ukraine through the Presbyterian Disaster Assistance (PDA) program. Over a third of Ukrainians have been forced from their homes and over 7 million displaced within the country. The majority are women, children and the elderly who are vulnerable in many ways. The first priority of PDA is funding to established and trusted partners on the ground who have knowledge of ongoing needs for food, housing and basic needs. The support also goes for psycho-social support, transitional care, and other services to support refugees who intend to stay in the host country until the conflict ends.

The Presbyterian Women thank you in advance for the support to these 2 worthwhile missions. <u>Checks can be made out to St. Andrew PW with notation</u> "Christmas Mission" and placed in **Sandy Poole's** mailbox, PW Treasurer. <u>Donations will be accepted until early January</u>, 2024.

As of October 22, 2023, we have not yet received our end-of-September financial reports from our bookkeeper, so we cannot address the expense side of our finances. Thus, this report addresses only those financial items that we have available at this time. Our total income for September was about the same as the average monthly income for 2023. You can see, however, that our YTD Actual income is over \$17,000 below the YTD budgeted amount. We are seeing some large expenses in October for facility maintenance, so we expect to see some large deficits that we will address by transferring some funds from our Ed Jones investment account back to our bank account.

A NOTE FROM THE RECEIVING TREASURER

At Saint Andrew, there are three categories of donations for operations:

- (1) "Pledged" for members and non-members who return identified Estimate of Giving cards with amounts designated.
- (2) "Unpledged" for members who either do not return a card or return a card with the "Unable to contribute..." box marked.
- (3) "Loose Plate" for non-pledging non-members and for unidentified donations from members. (For months with 5 Sundays, all loose plate donations of that week go to the Deacon's Fund.)

All identified donations are recorded and reported in four annual Reports of Contributions. These were formerly quarterly reports, but the first quarter report was moved to after the end of November to assist donors in meeting "pledged" amounts before the end of the budget year.

As I am quite capable of making "fat fingered" data entry errors, please review all of your Reports of Contributions so that corrections can be made in a timely manner.
