Dear Friends.

There is an old story about a child who had wandered off into the forest. The child was enchanted by the beauty of the trees, gently swaying in the breeze, and the leaves glistening in the late afternoon sun. The child clambered over the rocks and roots along the way, idly picking at the wild berries on nearby bushes. There was something to delight the child every which way they looked. Here was a spider's web and there was a mossy rock, and mesmerized by it all, the child lost all track of time and then realized that they were completely lost. The child tried to find their way out of the forest but every way they turned seemed only to lead them deeper into the forest. As the sun finally sank below the horizon, the child became increasingly afraid and wondered if they would ever make it home. But just as they were about to give up hope, another child appeared in the distance. The child who was lost called out to the other child, "I'm so happy to see you. I'm lost! Can you show me the way out of here?" The other child sighed and said, "I wish I could, but I'm lost too! But take my hand and we will find our way through the forest together."

Many of us may feel like a lost child, trying to find our way home. We wander through life confused by so much of what we see happening around the world. We are puzzled by our inability to getting along with each other. We are anxious about what the future might hold and fearful of what each day may bring. We stumble from one crisis to the next and feel like strangers living in a foreign land without the benefit of all the familiar landmarks and guideposts which have helped us along the way. The truth of the story of the two lost children, clasping each other's hand, and trying to find a way forward, teaches us that we need not make our way through life alone. Rather than be in competition with one another, fearful of those who are different and hesitant about acknowledging our vulnerabilities, we must see that we need each other, and we are in this life together and can offer one another support, help, and comfort along the way.

As Jesus made his way through life, he too knew what it was to need others. On his journey toward Jerusalem, through the forty days that we call Lent, we remember that Jesus drew great comfort from being with others. He called on the disciples to walk with him and, in the garden, he asked them to watch and wait while he prayed. Along the way, Jesus spent time being ministered to by the woman who anointed him with precious ointment and shared a meal with good friends Mary and Martha, who, no doubt, raised his spirits and gave him courage for the tasks that lay ahead.

Let us reach out to one another, whoever we are, and help each other along the way. Let us never be afraid to ask for help and always ready to offer a hand of friendship to those who are our companions on this journey through life.

Note that our 2024 budgeted expenses exceed our budgeted income by about \$7000. This is largely because we failed to reach our targeted pledge amount. We are currently at 94% of our target. If you have not made a pledge, please consider doing so now. If you have already made a pledge, consider increasing it so that we will have a better chance of balancing our budget.

Our expenses in January exceeded our income by \$4,216. Although our current <u>assets</u> of \$280,163 exceed our current liabilities of \$141,456 by a healthy amount, monthly deficits like we experienced in January eat away at that balance. Our total endowment fund amount continues to show steady growth, now sitting at \$639,165.

BE THE DONKEY

Corrie ten Boom, a devout Christian who helped shelter hundreds of Jewish people from Nazis during World War II, was asked how she stayed humble despite her fame.

"When Jesus rode into Jerusalem on Palm Sunday on the back of a donkey, and everyone was waving palm branches and throwing garments onto the road and singing praises, do you think that for one moment it ever entered the head of that donkey that any of that was for him?" she replied. "If I can be the donkey on which Jesus Christ rides in his glory, I give him all the praise and all the honor."

Jesus told his followers they'd need to carry (or "take up") their cross. But how well do you carry your Savior? How do you bring him into a world that desperately needs the good news of the gospel?
