- 1. Identify and interview interim candidates, make recommendation to Session
- 2. Session approves interim candidate
- 3. Define our future
- 4. Prepare for a new pastor
- 5. Update Mission Study [The Commission on Ministry (COM) of the Presbytery of Eastern Virginia (PEVA) must approve our Mission Study]

Net (Current Assets – Current Liabilities) = \$159,245

Our August income was the highest monthly income so far in 2024. This created a net income of \$8,046 for August and a year-to-date net income of \$18,256. These are the best results over the past four years! In addition, our endowment funds continue to grow, now totaling \$691,723. In spite of our good performance, our YTD Actual Income is below the YTD income that we budgeted. The fact that we are showing a nice YTD net income is a tribute to our committees who are doing a good job managing their expense budgets. Keep in mind our 2025 Stewardship Campaign theme, "God can do it; We can help." We hope that each of you will help by pledging to support the good work that we do at St. Andrew. Keep on the lookout for Stewardship Snippets that will appear in the Sunday Bulletin.
