#### **KIRK NIGHT CONTINUES!**

#### Join us on Wednesday evenings

Dinner at 5:45; Classes for all ages at 6:30 (No classes on November 13 – game night for all)

Adult Class You Are Not Alone: Caring for One Another in the Church: We live in difficult times. A recent Pew Research Center survey found that 41% of adults said that they experienced high levels of psychological distress during the pandemic. That number rose to 58% among young adults in the 18-29 age group. We are faced with news of violent conflicts throughout the world, political rhetoric in our own country is polarized in ways we haven't seen in many generations, and our beloved earth is facing its own climate crisis.

It is no wonder that anxiety and depression mark many of our days, and if not our own, then certainly those of people whom we love.

Kirk Night's adult class will continue to look at the topic of psychological well-being for the next several weeks through the lens of a curriculum called "Sanctuary Mental Health." These video-based classes are designed to equip us to enable the church to be a sanctuary, where we can face issues of mental health head-on, providing listening ears and resources for those experiencing these struggles.

"Sanctuary Mental Health" offers a unique blend of the voices of mental health professionals, theologians, and people with lived experience.

Join this safe space for learning and discussion each Wednesday evening at 6:30 p.m., through 11/20 (with a break on 11/13 for an all-church Game Night; see article to the right). The class will meet in Room 204 on the second floor of the education building and will be moderated by **Beth Lyon-Suhring**.

### Net (Current Assets – Current Liabilities) = \$169,178

Our net income for September was almost \$10,000 running our total YTD net income to \$28,189. This was largely because our expenses for September were the second lowest for the year. About \$6,000 of our net income was the result of the reduced payroll expense resulting from our pastor situation. We have put much of our cash balance to work drawing interest via risk-free money market instruments and certificates of deposit. Together, they are generating about \$1,000 per month in income. Our endowment funds are continuing to increase in value growing over \$17,000 in September. Our balance sheet currently looks strong with our current assets exceeding our current liabilities by \$169,178. Thanks to all of you for giving generously to St. Andrew and helping us to be good stewards of our church's resources.

## **A Note from the Receiving Treasurer**

At Saint Andrew, there are three categories of donations for operations:

- (1) "Pledged" for members and non-members who return identified Estimate of Giving cards with amounts designated.
- (2) "Unpledged" for members who either do not return a card or return a card with the "Unable to contribute..." box marked.
- (3) "Loose Plate" for non-pledging non-members and for unidentified donations from members. (For months with 5 Sundays, all loose plate donations of that week go to the Deacon's Fund.)

All identified donations are recorded and reported in four annual Reports of Contributions. These were formerly quarterly reports, but the first quarter report was moved to after the end of November to assist donors in meeting "pledged" amounts before the end of the budget year.

As I am quite capable of making "fat fingered" data entry errors, please review all of your Reports of Contributions so that corrections can be made in a timely manner.
