ST ANDREW WELCOMES THE REV DR LOU VENTURA IN JANUARY 2025

Ruling Elder and Transition Team Leader **Heather Gregg** announced to the congregation on October 20, 2024 that St. Andrew will welcome the **Rev Dr Lou Ventura** as our Interim/Transition Pastor on Monday, January 6, 2025 with her first Sunday in the pulpit on January, 12, 2025.

Below are excerpts taken from an email sent to the congregation on October 27, 2024:

"Rev. Dr. Lou received her Master of Divinity from Regent University, was ordained in 2013 and served at Franklin Presbyterian Church for nine years. She has served on PEVA's Commission on Ministry (COM), on their Presbytery Council, and earned her Doctor of Ministry from Pittsburgh Theological Seminary. She has had training from PCUSA in Interim/Transitional Ministry, Mediation, and Coaching.

(After additional training) she realized her heart's desire was really in the interim ministry part of a church's life, so she left Franklin Presbyterian Church and began serving as the Interim Pastor at Great Bridge Presbyterian Church. She has been at Great Bridge since the summer of 2022.

She is going to guide our family of faith through this interim process — understanding who we are and what kind of minister that we need, and preparing us to welcome our next installed pastor here at St. Andrew."

Please continue to pray for St. Andrew's leaders/officers, for our interim pastor Dr Rev Lou, for our future pastor, and for all of our church family as we go through the interim process. 2025 BUDGET & PLEDGE PROGRESS

St. Andrew's expense budget for 2025 is \$502,345. This represents a decrease of 5% compared to our current 2024 budget. Since our pledges in the past several years have represented about 81% of our total income, we set our pledge target for 2025 at 81% of our expected expenses. Thus, our target is \$406,900. As of the middle of November, we have received 71 pledges totaling \$378,290. This is 93% of our target – a shortage of \$28,610.

We still have 21 families that pledged this year, but have not yet responded. We could easily reach our target if those families pledged similar amounts to what they are currently giving. <u>If you have not yet submitted an</u> <u>"Estimate of Giving" card, please do so before the end of</u> <u>December.</u> If you need an "Estimate of Giving" card, you can pick up one from the table at the entrance to the sanctuary.
