

As I mentioned in my sermon on

January 12, I am overjoyed to be with you and learn more about the people and missions of St. Andrew! My first

There are times when I will be offsite at meetings; I am a trustee at the Presbytery of Eastern Virginia (PEVA), and also will begin a 3-year term in February on PEVA's Commission on Ministry (COM), which comes with monthly meetings as well as other responsibilities. I also am active in my DAR chapter. <u>Please Note</u>: I'd just like to mention as a precaution that I will NEVER email or text anyone asking them to purchase gift cards. Email and text scammers are incredibly active and clever, and I just want to make sure everyone knows that this is not something I would do.

My husband, Ron, will be an occasional visitor. He remains a member at Franklin Presbyterian, and is currently an active elder there. Ron retired in 2023 from Anthem and holds down the fort at home. I am a petlover, although my husband and I have been pet-free since 2020 when our last cat, Murphy, passed at 19. He was one of four cats. Two dogs, Cooper the black Lab and Logan the yellow Lab, had also been part of our family. As we move forward, your individual voice will be a critical part of the collective thoughts and feelings about where St. Andrew has been and where you believe God is calling you as a congregation. Your input will be an integral part of preparing for your next installed pastor. I am enthusiastically anticipating great discussions and constructive thoughts on the past, present, and future of this congregation.

ADULT CHURCH SCHOOL CLASSES All adults are invited to join one of our classes in the Education Building from 11:00 – Noon, each Sunday following the worship service. Select a class that sounds interesting to you and feel free to join in at anytime during the session. They Walked with God: 40 Bible Characters Who Inspire

<u>Us</u> by Max Lucado: Each week the class will look at a different character in scripture, exploring their story in the context of their time. Author Max Lucado brings these characters to life and shares the crucial message: If God can find a place for each character in the Bible, we can rest assured that he's carved out a spot for us, too. **The Homebuilder Class**, comprised of parents of children of all ages and led by **Karen & Mike Topping** and **Becky & Shaun Nagy**, will continue this study and meet in Room 101 on the first floor of the educational building.

A Study of Hebrews: Looking Forward in Faith by William Carter: This seven-session study of Hebrews seeks to help Christians grow strong in their faith by pointing out that, in Jesus Christ, God has provided for them all that is needed for their redemption. The lessons focus on aspects of God's provisions--the living Word, the promise of rest, the Great High Priest, and the new covenant--as well as that which God expects--confident faith, disciplined commitment, and daily Christian living. The Jack Holladay Class, led by Frances Jornov started this new study on January 26. It meets in Room 206 on the second floor of the educational building.

Gospel of Mark: A Beginner's Guide to the Good News by AJ Levine: The class will study the Bible's earliest source for the life of Jesus with scholar Amy-Jill Levine as she examines John the Baptizer, the Little Apocalypse, the Transfiguration, and several of Jesus's most notable stories and parables. The Good News of the gospel message comes alive in this book as we see Jesus as divine and human, powerful and weak, approachable yet mysterious. The book features an in-depth study of select passages and illuminates the Gospel in its historical context and as a source for the other gospels. **The Challenge of Faith Class**, led by **Steve Suhring,** meets in Room 204 on the second floor of the educational building.

Net (Current Assets – Current Liabilities) = \$226,928

Our income for December was \$59,596, by far the largest monthly income for the year. Some end of year IRA contributions were largely responsible for the increased income. Our expenses for December were \$29,705. This was the second lowest monthly expense for the year. Together, the result was a monthly net income of \$29,891 and a net income for the year of \$86,110 – a nice Christmas present for St. Andrew.

Compared to our annual <u>budget</u>, our actual income for the year was \$513,812 vs. the budgeted amount of \$521,850. Our actual expenses for the year of \$427,702 were significantly below the total budgeted amount of \$528,805. This large difference was mainly the result of reduced payroll expenses.

Our net current assets minus current liabilities (mostly earmarks) was \$226,928. In addition to our current assets, we have \$715,475 in our endowment funds and our only long-term liability is our mortgage balance of \$412,281. Our mortgage must be refinanced in a few months, and with high inflation, we will almost certainly be paying a higher interest rate than we have on our current loan.

The church's finances are in good shape! Thanks to all of you for generously supporting St. Andrew with your donations, your time and talent, and for helping us be good stewards of the church's resources.

The change in the weather has increased the presence of mice in the church facilities. To help abate the problem, we've established the following procedures:

• No food left on tables and countertops, unless stored in a sealed plastic/metal container or placed in the refrigerators.

• All counters, tables, etc., must be thoroughly wiped down after food has been served.

• All committees serving food on Kirk Night or other events are responsible for taking trash bags to the dumpster at the conclusion of the event. If assistance is required, please notify a member of the Property Committee.

• Pet food/birdseed must be stored in a sealed plastic container. Unopened food in cardboard containers

(ex: breakfast cereal) should also be placed in sealed containers.

Please do your part to keep the church clean and free of items that attract rodents. Please see one of the Property Deacons if you have any questions.
