

### SESSION HIGHLIGHTS

#### **February Stated Session Meeting**

After a busy fall and advent season, SAPC has received several thank you letters acknowledging support and donations, including Restoration Farms, Western Tidewater Free Clinic, Presbyterian Giving Catalog, Coalition Against Poverty in Suffolk (CAPS), Suffolk Christian Fellowship Center, Black Mountain Presbyterian Church (NC), Isle of Wight Christian Outreach Program, Mercy Chefs, and Community Efforts Inc. Our support helps these organizations do a tremendous amount of work throughout the community—thank you for your generosity!

SAPC's current mortgage comes due for renewal in March. This renewal will establish new terms of payment and interest rate until the next renewal date. The Finance Committee is working on applications and evaluating the best option for our congregation at this time.

Each spring, we are required to fill out a Statistical Report to the Presbytery for the previous calendar year. A copy of the filed report is posted in the office for the congregation's information.

Session is looking to reestablish the <u>Safety</u> <u>Committee</u>, which will report directly to Session and have the task of evaluating all aspects of safety at SAPC, making recommendations where needed. *If you are interested in serving in this capacity, please see* **Heather Gregg** or **Pastor Lou**.

#### **Music Notes from Al**

How DO they pick the music for Sunday services? Ever asked that question? Well, here's the secret – The scriptures for each week have been put together in a 3-year repeating sequence called the 'lectionary', so that's usually how the scriptures are chosen. There is an index in the back of the hymnal that shows the hymns that go well with certain scriptures. Another resource that we use has been created by the Presbyterian Association of Musicians, who print a worship aid that offers musical suggestions – not just hymns, but service music, included anthems for the choir and bell choir.

So, if you've come away from a service thinking, "Wow, the music and the scriptures went together so well today!", it was no accident, but it is what we try to do each week.

That's not to say that sometimes music is chosen just because 'AI really likes that song.' Yes, that happens sometimes too!

#### **PRAYERS & SQUARES**

Do you have a friend, co-worker, or family member who has health issues, is experiencing difficulties, or is making challenging decisions? Let them know God is with them by sharing a prayer quilt with them. You can choose a Prayer Pocket Square or a lap quilt Prayer Quilt.

Prayer Pocket Squares are small quilted squares with one tie that you can send in a card or letter or give to a friend, or give to someone to show you are thinking of them and praying for them. You do not have to make a request. Look for them in a plastic bin in the atrium. Anyone can just look at the squares in the bin and choose one to give to someone. Say a prayer, tie a knot, place it in a thinking of you card and give it. Let someone know you care and are praying for them.

You may request a Prayers and Squares lap sized quilt by completing a request form or by contacting **Frances Jornov** at francesjrnv@charter.net or 757-646-8955. Place the form in the Prayers and Squares mailbox in the office or give it to Frances. These quilts will be placed on a quilt rack in the atrium for people to say a prayer and tie a knot. There are many completed quilts in our cabinet. It is a great pleasure to share God's love by giving a quilt to someone.

Prayers and Squares will meet on Friday, March 21, at 10:00am in St. Andrew Hall. We will only meet once in March. We can use all helpers and you don't need to know how to sew. There are jobs that don't require sewing skills and all ages are welcome. Also, we are working on creating quilts to give to the children and adults as part of the Angel Tree Christmas gifts again this December. Interested in helping us--come join us.

Net (Current Assets – Current Liabilities) = \$223,616

St. Andrew experienced a net deficit of \$2,851 in January. Our endowment funds continued to grow nicely, increasing by about \$14,000 for the month. The main financial issue facing St. Andrew in the next few months is the required refinancing of our mortgage. We expect to see an increase in the interest rate that we will have to pay, but since we have reduced the balance, our monthly amount will likely decrease. All in all, our church finances remain in good shape.
