By the time you read this, we will have celebrated Resurrection Day—Easter—and I will be out of the office for a week on vacation. (Thank you, **Rev.**

Leigh Gillis, for filling the pulpit while I'm out!)

Much as with Christmas, the Easter perspective is one I wish the world (including me!) could maintain for much longer than it does. The joy and sense of a new beginning, even if every feature of that new beginning isn't fully known, can bring renewed purpose and fresh, positive change. Easter reminds us that **we are resurrection people**—the new world that God has in store for us, into which we have been baptized, has already begun—and we're reminded that **now** is the time to begin to live into that identity. Taking the high road, doing the right thing, despite the pain it can bring, is a lesson Jesus taught us from the cross. Very few decisions in our lives today can compare to the choices that faced Jesus that final week—and that perspective is one that can help sustain us through our own challenges and trials.

I thought I would also share with you here a couple of the things I'm working on in conjunction with interim tasks. There are a lot of administrative projects that need to be done; one of the first is to incorporate. Our *Book of Order* requires that churches should incorporate where permitted by civil law. Prior to a landmark case in 2002, Virginia and West Virginia were the only two states that prohibited churches from incorporating. Now approximately 90% of Virginia churches are incorporated, and St. Andrew will soon join them.

In the article to the right, you will see that **Beth Martin** will begin as a full-time Office Manager at the end of April. I'm looking forward to working with Beth more as we build up the office resources for both the congregation and its church leaders. All of this is part of the work of an interim—helping to prepare the church for its next called installed pastor by ensuring that staff, policies, and processes are in place for a smooth transition.

It is my prayer that you will have had a meaningful and joyful Easter. Alleluia! Christ is risen!

<u>ST ANDREW NOW HAS A</u> <u>FULL-TIME OFFICE MANAGER</u>

Beth Martin now has a full-time schedule (Monday-Friday, 8:30am – 4:30pm, as of April 28) as St. Andrew's Office Manager.

The Session determined that, with the departure of Director of Christian Education Beth Lyon-Suhring and the upcoming retirement of Youth Director **Angie Hillis-Baurle** (August 29), clerical and front office coverage was needed to provide a consistent resource for staff, the work of the church, deliveries, phone calls, and other vendors and repair techs that need to access the building during the week.

April 10, 2025 Stated Session Meeting

➢ The Finance Committee has completed our mortgage loan renewal paperwork with TowneBank. The new loan is amortized over 15 years, but will renew again in 5 years, similar to the arrangements for our previous loan and the renewal that came due in March. Many thanks to the committee for diligently managing this renewal - it was a long, and important, process!

Session approved Audio/Visual improvements that you will see in use very soon! These improvements will greatly improve the reliability of our live stream and improve participation for all worship attendees and participants, regardless of location within the sanctuary. The improvements also include a new speaker in the cry room/parlor! These improvements were partially funded through a Presbytery of Eastern Virginia grant.


We are looking forward to our next Kirk Night in the fall.
