#### **FALL CHURCH SCHOOL**

#### Classes begin on September 14

We extend a warm invitation to join our Sunday morning education program. All classes begin at 11:00am immediately after the morning worship service, and meet in the Christian Education building, directly behind the main building.

#### **Adult Church School**

Whether you've been studying scripture for years or are new to the faith, we welcome you to add your voice to our conversations in our adult studies.

- ➤ The Message of Jesus: Words That Changed the World by Adam Hamilton. Hamilton explores six of the most important themes in Jesus's teachings, why they matter and how they speak to us today. This study will explore Jesus's preaching on the Kingdom of God, the Sermon on the Mount, the parables, and the "I am" sayings in John. Join us as we study Jesus's message that is not only life-changing, but world-changing. The Jack Holladay Class, led by Frances Jornov, meets in room 206 on the second floor of the education building.
- The Screwtape Letters by C.S. Lewis. This class is for anyone interested in understanding human nature and the subtle ways temptation works. This book uses a unique format of letters from Screwtape to his nephew by instructing him on how to tempt a human away from faith and virtue. The class will focus on one letter a week. This perspective offers insight into common human weaknesses and the ongoing struggle between good and evil. The Christians in Action (CIA) Class, led by Karen & Mike Topping and Becky & Shaun Nagy, meets in room 101 on the first floor of the educational building.
- Appreciate These Things: Eight Ways of Cultivating Compassion by Jill J. Duffield. This study is a guide to finding and elevating the good in the midst of hard times. Though we may be tempted toward despair or anger, readers will be inspired toward hope by Paul's words in Philippians 4:8, "Finally, brothers and sisters, whatever is true, whatever is honorable, whatever is just, whatever is pure, whatever is pleasing, whatever is commendable, if there is any excellence and if there is anything worthy of praise, think about these things." The class will explore these eight chapters on the adjectives in Paul's list. The Challenge of Faith Class, led by Steve Suhring, meets in room 204 on the second floor of the educational building.

#### Children's Church School

St Andrew's church school for kindergarten and elementary students is a workshop-based program which focuses on one Bible story each month. The theme for 2025-2026 is "What Does it Mean to do God's Will?"

September's focus is Noah. Classes meet on the first floor of the Christian Education Building.

#### Youth classes

The Middle and Senior High School curriculum is "Follow Me: Biblical Practices for Faithful Living." They meet in room 202 on the second floor of the Christian Ed building. Preschool Classes

Our youngest members (infant to age 4) meet in room 12 in the main church building where they will hear Bible stories, color, work on craft activities, and play with friends, all under the care of our team of preschool teachers.

# **September is Hunger Action Month**

#### Did you Know?

According to the Foodbank of Southeastern Virginia and the Eastern Shore, 152,720 people in our region are food insecure. That means 1 in 8 people are unsure where their next meal will come from. Among children, the rate is even more alarming: 1 in 5 with some communities seeing rates as high as 1 in 3. These numbers represent real people. Last year the Foodbank distributed over 20 million meals, yet the need goes on. The good news is that St. Andrew has always generously supported the

# St. Andrew's Mid-Week Program for All Ages September 24 through November 12, 2025

What in the world is a 'Kirk Night'?

'Kirk' is the Scottish word for church,
so 'Kirk Night' is an evening spent at church.
At St. Andrew, Kirk Night is an evening that
includes a meal and programming for all ages. The fall
season of Kirk Night begins Wednesday, September 24.
Come for the meal, join us for the classes, or take part in
both. Here are the details:

<u>Dinner</u>: Kirk Night dinners are provided by a different church organization each week. Check the church bulletin on Sunday to find the menu for Wednesday. Dinner begins at 5:45pm and ends at 6:30 when classes start. The cost is \$4.50 for adults and \$2.50 for children, with a maximum charge of \$20.00 per family.

<u>Classes</u>: Join our classes for elementary-aged children through adults. Nursery care will be available by request. Classes begin at 6:30pm and run through 7:30pm. For Children

- 6:30 7:00 Music Makers Music Class (Room 14, behind the sanctuary) Children from first grade through fifth grade can participate in this child-centered music program. Led by **Angela Hillis-Baurle** and **Amanda Greco**, children are introduced to new songs, musical prayers, and instruments that are all combined in worship to praise God.
- 7:00 7:30 The children's art class this fall will offer first through fifth graders an opportunity to participate in making a diorama of the story of Jesus' birth as found in the Gospel of Luke 2: 1-8. The class will meet in the Christian Ed building in Room 103 and will be led by **Steve Suhring** and **Liz Fachin**.

#### For Youth

• 5:45 – 7:30 – Youth Group meets in Room 202 on the second floor of the education building under the direction of **Youth Director Andrew Kowalski**. Middle School and High School youth begin with dinner and enjoy fellowship and learning together.


#### For Adults

• 6:30 – 7:30: The adult study will be held on the second floor of the education building where we will be studying Bishop N.T. Wright's book *Surprised By Hope* – *Rethinking Heaven, the Resurrection and the Mission of the Church*.

Wright begins the Preface of the book with these two questions: "What are we waiting for? and "What are we going to do about it in the meantime?" He then goes on to tell us that: "First it is about the ultimate future hope held out in the Christian gospel: the hope that is for salvation, resurrection, eternal life, and the cluster of other things that go with them. Second, it is about the discovery of hope within the present world: about the practical ways in which hope can come alive for communities and individuals who for whatever reasons may lack it. And it is about the ways in which embracing the first can and should generate and sustain the second."

If these questions intrigue you and you want to be surprised by hope, come join in the discussion which will be led by **David McKercher**.

#### Net (Current Assets – Current Liabilities) = \$195,993

Total income for July 2025 was \$49,584, the highest monthly income this year. Total expenses were \$35,901, the second lowest monthly expense. These resulted in a net positive monthly income of \$13,683 for July and a net positive year-to-date annual income of \$20,234. In addition, our endowment funds increased by almost \$10,000. All in all, July was a very good month financially for St. Andrew.

Our stewardship campaign will begin in September. Be on the lookout for our 2026 stewardship theme and our "Stewardship Snippets" that will appear in the Sunday Bulletins.

#### **Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD)**

You can also donate a QCD check that you write from a brokerage firm custodian IRA account, provided that the firm offers check writing features on their IRA accounts. If you are able to use this option in the future, "QCD" should be added on the check's memo line, and it must be deposited into the church's bank account before the end of the calendar year to receive the income tax benefit. As is the current practice, the QCD donation will be indicated on your Report of Contributions for reducing your taxable income versus being a tax deduction.
