Net (Current Assets – Current Liabilities) = \$203,805

Total income for September was \$34,950, over \$10,000 below the August income. Our September expenses were \$40,868. Therefore, our income was almost \$6,000 less than our expenses. Year-to-date, however, our net income is still positive sitting now at \$26,797. Our endowment funds continued their nice growth, now totaling \$781,680. Our finances as of the end of September remain healthy, but the decrease in monthly income is disturbing.

#### A Note from the Receiving Treasurer

At St. Andrew, there are three categories of donations for operations:

- (1) "Pledged" for members and non-members who return identified Estimate of Giving cards with amounts designated.
- (2) "Unpledged" for members who either do not return a card or return a card with the "Unable to contribute..." box marked.
- (3) "Loose Plate" for non-pledging non-members and for unidentified donations from members. (For months with 5 Sundays, all loose plate donations of that week go to the Deacon's Fund.)

All identified donations are recorded and reported in four annual Reports of Contributions. These were formerly quarterly reports, but the first quarter report was moved to after the end of November to assist donors in meeting "pledged" amounts before the end of the budget year.

As I am quite capable of making "fat fingered" data entry errors, please review all of your Reports of Contributions so that corrections can be made in a timely manner.
